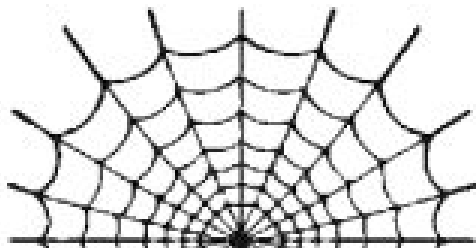


Course Description

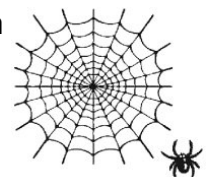

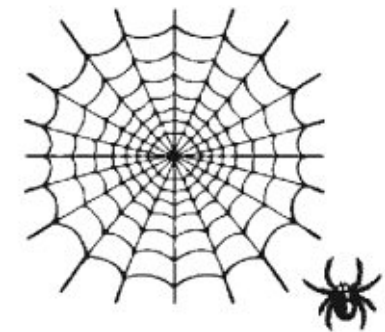

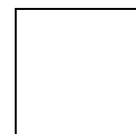
